

Sharon Shares Her Story of Life Change

My name is Sharon and I am a 62 year old widow with a traumatic brain injury. I have lived with a disability since 1986 as a result of an auto accident. I was in a coma for 2 months and then a rehab facility for 5 months learning how to live again. I lost it all: emotionally, mentally, physically and spiritually.

I have been on a 38 year journey of recovery and discovery. One of my best discoveries yet has come through AARP. This program allows senior citizens to participate in gaining experience at a non-profit in order equip them for employment in today's world. In the fall of 2024 I was sent to Interfaith's Center for Life to interview with the Manager, Cherie Galloway. When I walked into the Center for Life I could instantly feel the presence of God. I felt a divine connection that caused me to fight back my tears. For the first time I felt the reality of life with neither judgement or shame. It had been a long time since I felt dignity and worthiness. After leaving the interview I began to pray and ask God for an open door and to make room for me at the Center for Life. A few days later I received an invitation to become part of their training program. Since then my life has changed for the better.

As a greeter, I have been blessed to become the first face clients see when they come into our building. I have become a participant and a recipient of the many blessings provided by Interfaith. These blessings have been countless because of the generosity and determination of each department at Interfaith. From Andrea at Social Services that helped me get my leaking roof repaired, Shannon at the Thrift Store helped me with a walker, Karla and Emily found funding for a heater to keep me warm during the winter months, and to the staff at the Center for Life who

Every day I show up to serve our community's most vulnerable population. I am able to show love, dignity and respect to others because it has been given to me through the actions of those who serve at Interfaith. I thank God everyday for such a rich, meaningful and fulfilling experience at the Center for Life. This experience has given me a second chance to experience life at its fullest and I thank you so very much.

Finally, Spring is upon us! If you find yourself doing any Spring cleaning keep Interfaith in mind. We could turn that lamp into medicine! Often people reach out to me and say they have a household item to donate but they want it to go to someone in need. So I want to explain how your gently used items (household and clothing) benefit those in need when given to Interfaith. All clothing donations go to one of three places; the Interfaith Thrift Store where they are sold to help us pay for prescription medications for those who do not have insurance, or our FREE Clothing Boutique where we allow people to come in 5 days a week and get clothing at no charge; what is left is sold with a company that sends it overseas. Some of the gently used furnishings donated at our Thrift Store are given to our shelter residents as they move out and set up their apartments. We also help families that have been

victims of a fire. This year we will be working with 2 partner agencies to furnish apartments for them. Last year, our store donated over \$26,000 worth of merchandise to help people in need. The store also donated \$6,000 worth of shoes to our free boutique. With the proceeds that were left, *the store funds critical services at Interfaith*. The council is comprised of our homeless "members" of the Engagement Center and staff, who establish the rules and guidelines for the Engagement Center and its operation.

As we continue to work them, their ultimate goal is for Nina and Cameron to be housed, get their family back together and to live the life that they want. In our eyes they are a success story and a true blessing to all that come into contact with them.
